Math: Continue subtracting double digit numbers. You can make up some problems to practice at home like we do in class.

I don't give much homework but when I do some are saying they don't have time to do it. They have family coming over or practice of some sort. Please encourage your child to review what we do in school each day. Especially reading and math.

Most are doing great in math fluency. I'm so pleased with them. They just need to review the sheets we do in class to see it a second time. The more they practice double digit addition/subtraction the better they become.

It's like with anything, you can't get better if you don't practice. Please help your child by showing them their school work is important. I told them it was their job just like parents have a job. You parents wouldn't only do part of your work. It's their responsibility to remind or show you their work and have you listen to them read. They can read the passage I send home every week each night to be able to say those words by sight since they aren't due until Friday.

Thank you for all you do to help me with your children and their school work!! It really does make a difference.
